

**Romans 10:14-15**

“14 How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? ## Discussion Questions

3. Share one thing you learned this Sunday about John Stark and Oral Bible Translation. What's one thing that stood out to you as you listened?
4. Where were you and what was going on in your life at the time when you responded to the Gospel? (The good news that Jesus died in your place.) Who did God send to you so you could hear?
5. Read Romans 10:14-15 together. What does this phrase mean to you "you are saved to be sent"? Do you see yourself as one "being sent", one who is "sending" others or one who is "receiving"?
6. What do you think about this principle: "People have to hear the message of the Gospel to benefit from it and those who believe are the one's who can share it?"

7. Why do you think it's so hard to see ourselves as missionaries called by God to share our faith in our own village, nation and around the world? What's easier for you: to pray, give or go?

## Application Questions & Prayer

8. According to the Joshua Project, there are 4.5 Billion people in the world who claim to be non-Christian. About ½ of those people have yet to hear the Gospel message. What do you think God is wanting us (His church) to do to reach them? What is preventing us from reaching them?
9. What does it mean for you to take the next step in being sent by God to the people in your life who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ? To the people across the globe who have yet to hear the Gospel?
10. Take time together to ask God that He would move in the hearts of people in our church to say "yes" to God. To **Pray**: for our partners, to **Give**: to our efforts to reach people both locally and globally and then to **Go**: to their families, neighborhoods, schools, workplaces and short-term trips.
