Grace, not works, is the key to a brand-new life—bringing healing from our past, impacting our present, and securing our future. For anyone feeling weighed down, Paul's message is clear: choose Jesus over Adam, and experience the life-transforming power through God's gift of grace. This isn't just theology; it's a call for you to understand your true identity and to live as a new creation, full of hope, free from the tyranny of sin and death. Icebreaker: Who is the greatest? 7. Does your understanding of God's grace impact the way you see and treat others, especially those who have hurt or disappointed you?

8. What are some ways we can share the message of grace with others, especially in a world that may be skeptical or even hostile toward faith?

9. Knowing that Jesus has defeated death how does this give you hope in your current challenges?

10. What would it look like for you to fully embrace your identity in Christ in the coming week? Is there a specific area where you want to step into this new identity more boldly?
